Grade 11

Our 4-week CIT program is designed to help prepare campers to move into the next level – being on staff. The next week, the group will travel to Camp Menogyn to learn more about wilderness and trail skills from some of the best on a trip in the BWCA with our CIT Coordinator and a trail guide from Camp Menogyn.
